

# Musical Meditation "In Memoriam to the Victims of Chornobyl" Judy Widrig by Larysa Kuzmenk

In Memoriam to the Victims of Chornobyl was composed in 1997 to reflect on the tragedy of the world's worst nuclear accident. It's in three sections. The opening theme is ominous. It sets the mood for the upcoming tragic event. Following this motive, I quote a rather sad yet lyrical Ukrainian folk tune, which text describes a person walking in a graveyard to visit a loved one. The tempo suddenly quickens and the material becomes loud and rhythmic--the mechanical sound of the reactor. Amid all the chaos, the folk tune is harmonized over dissonant chords and is rhythmically and melodically manipulated. The music eventually arrives at its first climax. At this point, the music signals the reactor's first explosion. The music then becomes very quiet and the tempo slows. Here, the folk tune takes on a kind of pointillist texture. This section represents the invisible, yet fatal radioactive particles that are poisoning the environment. The tempo quickens, and the music builds towards the second climax signaling the second explosion. Here, I quote a sacred chant from the Ukrainian Orthodox church, asking God for forgiveness. The piece ends with the reappearance of the folk tune and the opening material, setting a mood that questions the future of our planet.




